

Supplemental Information for Energy Tax Credits

Please keep in mind: only items certified by the manufacturer which meet government standards qualify for these credits.

Placed in service 1/1/23 – 12/31/23

<u>30% of the cost up to \$2,000</u>

Air Source Heat Pumps Biomass Stoves/Boilers Heat Pump Water Heaters

30% of the cost up to \$600

Central Air Conditioners Electric Panel Upgrade Furnaces (Natural Gas, Oil) Hot Water Boilers (Natural Gas, Propane, Oil) Water Heaters (Natural Gas) Windows and Skylights

30% of the cost up to \$500

Exterior Doors

<u>30% of the cost up to \$1,200</u>

The following home energy credits will expire 12/31/2022:

Product:

Solar Energy Systems, Geothermal Heat Pumps, Small Wind Turbines, and Fuel Cells (Existing homes and new construction qualify; principal and secondary homes qualify; rentals do not qualify) Biomass Fuel Cells 26% of the cost, placed in service before 1/1/23

22% of the cost, placed in service before 1/1/24

26% of the cost, placed in service before 12/31/22

The following Equipment Tax Credits for Primary Residences will expire 12/31/2022:
